

The 30th Yuma Symposium begins on Thursday, Feb. 26, 2009 with registration, a social gathering and the traditional pin swap from 3:30 - 6:30 p.m. at Lute's Casino, 221 S Main Street. Orientation and informal introductions of the presenters will follow at 7 pm.

Pieces are to be hand delivered to the Yuma Art Center, Friday morning from 8 to 10 am, and reclaimed from 12 and 2 pm. Saturday. Although every effort will be taken to ensure the safety and security of the work, submission is at the student's own risk.
